Crafting Handmade Shoes

While going through the new book section of the library I saw "Crafting Handmade Shoes," so of course I checked it out.

The book addresses making shoes without a last, with real soles, but no heels to speak of. It goes through basic construction techniques and then presents projects. Overall it was well written and clear. There are clear directions, suggested glues (by brand name and type) and a list of sources for shoe making supplies.

The projects include a fair number of closed toe shoes that could easily be used for SCA and Ren-Fair. The techniques are mostly done by hand. In the case of some types of sole application you may want to farm it out to your local shoe shop because of the equipment that is needed. There is a surprising amount of detail about placing patterns on leather for the best results in the finished product.

Over all this appears to be a good starting place if you need to make some simple shoes. My only quibble with the book is that it does not go into arch supports, speaking as a person with high arches.

I would suggest checking it out from your library or through inter-library loan it is a good craft book.
