Denvention Masquerade AnnAwards

Vastly more qualified judges have already given out the official awards, but for what it's worth (probably less than two cents in the current economy), here are my unofficial "AnnAwards" for the Denvention Masquerade:

Shiny! I Want it! Award: "A Midsummer Night's Dream" was grand Elizabethan style on glitter steroids with enormous wings. Photos and video can't capture just how sparkly these costumes were. Gorgeous! This one was definitely the hands-down favorite of my shallow, sparkly little soul.

Laugh-Out-Loud Award: I'm neither a Star Trek fan nor a Frank Sinatra fan, but even I was delighted by the clever "Chairman of the Borg" filk parodying "New York, New York" as "The Borg, The Borg." The costume and makeup were simple but effective, and the vocal impression was dead-on. I will long remember Ol' Blue Eyes assuring us that "Resistance is futile, baby." Deja Vu All Over Again Award: The song "Here Comes the Sun" came twice, both during "The Calm After the Storm" and "Here Comes the Sun." Although the Denver theme was "A mile closer to the stars," apparently we were also "A mile closer to the sun."

More Disney than Disney Award: The professional-looking Jack Skellington and Oogie Boogie from "A Nightmare in Denver" looked as authentic as the Jack Skellington audio-animatronic figures I've seen in the Haunted Mansion Holiday ride at Disneyland.

And Now for Something Completely Different Award: Loud cheers greeted "The legendary Black Beast of Arrrghhh!" and the clever knight mannequins. A little Monty Python makes every masquerade better!

Nostalgia Award: "Schoolhouse Rock Presents: A Reconsideration of the Astronomical Status of Dwarf Planet Pluto" brought me right back to my school days, with its catchy Schoolhouse Rock song, cheesy 70s-animation-style costumes, and smiley sun curtain. Regrettably, they did not play a reprise of "Here Comes the Sun" or they would have received even bigger laughs.

Best Defiance of Expectations Award: I initially thought "Princess Mariam Suzetta" was going to be a melodramatic, "alas for the heartsick, pretty princess" entry; when it shifted gears midstream into a parody of itself, it caught me completely off-guard and left me smiling.

MacGyver Award: You had to love "War Machine," the entry which admitted straight out that its costume breastplate was made from a rubber car floor mat.

Jurassic Award: "Grave Robbers" gave you dinosaurs life-size and in 3-D. Who needs CGI when you have costumers?

Most Unintentionally Humorous Placement of a Bear Award: First, let me say that the costume design of the bear and the shaman in "The Dream Time" was very impressive and well-done -- the bear looked almost real, and the shaman figure had a great stylized design -- while the concept of the union of the bear/shaman was striking. I just have to admit that there was one moment when the bear was hunched over the shaman when . . . er . . . let's just say that it looked as if the bear really, *really* liked the shaman. A lot.
