

Think ahead! <u>Submissions deadline is the 5th of the month</u> so newsletter can be e-mailed by the 10th. I have a very strong preference for an on-time newsletter over a feature-packed one. Late submissions will go into the next month's issue. If there is a change in a meeting time or venue, make sure I know about it before press time. I report things, I don't decide them.

I'm flexible for submission formats. E-mail saves time, but you can give me a disc or hard copy if you need to. I accept papyrus and clay tablets. Handwriting is subject to my interpretation. <u>Here's your style manual</u>: Font=12-Point Times New Roman. Single-space your paragraphs with no indent at the beginning and a double carriage return between paragraphs. Put just one space after a period.

The newsletter will be computer spell-checked, so please warn me if any of your words have unconventional spellings. I once used the word "paronomal" in the title for an evening event at an SF convention. The program book editor's spellchecker changed it to "paranormal." Instead of a pun contest, I got a bunch of people who wanted to talk about psychic powers and UFOs.

Cactus Needles is kind of like a real newspaper. We're under the same constraints of copyright law as professional publishers, as well as my personal standards for good manners. Much as I enjoy the latest photo essay of cunningly carved vegetables or Halloween costumes for dogs circulating around the net, I can't print it unless I have some kind of permission from the writer, photographer or other copyright holder.

We can, however, print our own review of an online article and include a link that tells the reader where to find the original article in our "On The Web" column. The Adobe Acrobat .pdf format of the e-newsletter allows me to include active hyperlinks. If you read the newsletter on your computer, just click the blue underlined text and your web browser should open and take you to the site.

For news that happens on too short notice for a monthly newsletter (There's a one-day sale at the fabric store!), the "Guildsters" Yahoogroups e-mail listserve is a good way to get the word out. Drop your editor an e-mail and he'll send you the standard invitation. Guildsters is also a fine forum for picking SWCG members' brains about your current project and for making personal announcements.

Please keep me posted if you change your e-mail address. I'd appreciate it if each of you would e-mail me an acknowledgement that you have received this newsletter, so I know your address is good.

Dillinger Days at the Hotel Congress

311 East Congress, Tucson, Arizona Story and Photos by Rebecca Petithory -Hayes



The Hotel congress was built in 1919 for the tourists coming in on the train. It also had rooms for railroad workers in the basement. It is a small hotel with three stories (this was before the fire, more on that later). The hotel had 82 rooms, a bar and entertainment area, and small shops around the outside.

In 1932, Dillinger and his gang came to town and stayed at the Congress Hotel. They thought they would not be known in a podunk town in Arizona. How they got caught was fun. The boiler in the basement caught fire and the fire went up the elevator shaft to the third floor. They talked a fireman into getting their bags, which were heavier than they should have been with money and guns! Well, one of the cops spotted Dillinger (his face had been on one of the magazines he had been reading). It took them a couple of days but they caught on. The Tucson Police were the only department that Dillinger never escaped from.

The hotel started Dillinger Days in 1994 as a small hotel event. In 2004, the event moved to the street and beyond. In recent years they have added a vintage car show around the hotel, vendors, street bands and tours.

The hotel had 82 rooms before the fire. It now has 40 (the third floor was never rebuilt). It boasts several ghost-haunted rooms and great food. The hotel staff is really helpful and gracious. Worth a stay.

Event Times: Jan 22, 2011 10 AM-4 PM

The show starts around 11 am with a lunch break. Second half stars around 1:30 PM. This will be put on by the Hot Shot Players. There will be tours of the hotel throughout the day. Historical walking tours will be given in the morning and afternoon by Ken Scoville and Andy Dowdle. The Downtown Historical Museum (140 North Stone) will be open from 10 AM - 4 PM, free for the day. They normally have the guns from the Dillinger gang on display for this event. Street vendors will be there as well.



I have attended this event for the last several years. It is a blast! Costume is welcome (30s style). I am not planning to costume for this as I will be shooting the event with camera not gun!
