Kentucky Fried Headphones

Here's another sneaky use for your crafting and costuming skills.



I just purchased a new set of Bluetooth wireless headphones to use with my iPod, laptop and cell phone. These are Tenqa ReMxd, a DJ earmuff style headphone with a band over the top of the head – my favorite kind. There's just one problem. They don't fit. This is my trouble, not the designer's. I have big ears, somewhere between Prince Charles and Dopey. The ear cups of off-the-shelf headphones hardly ever fit. I needed a way to enlarge the ear cups without wrecking the general appearance of the 'phones.

As mentioned in the February, 2012 Cactus Needles, KFC now serves mashed potatoes and other side dishes in reusable plastic containers. The outside diameter of the bowl is just big enough for my ear and the diameter of the dimple in the bottom of the bowl is just right to fit into the notch around the outside of the 'phones that held the original vinyl and foam covers.



After my mods, the ear cups are much larger.

I sliced off the rim of the bowl and the middle dimple with a craft knife, cut rings of foam rubber with scissors, and sewed tubes of t-shirt knit fabric to wrap around the inside and outside of the new ear cups. I dismantled the speakers with a screwdriver (thereby voiding my warranty) slipped the new ear cups in place, and replaced the speakers inside. I supplemented my newly padded ear cups with the covers from an old, broken set of headphones that had fit well. I wish I had taken some in-progress pictures, but I didn't think this was really going to work. It did and now I have a set of wireless headphones that fit

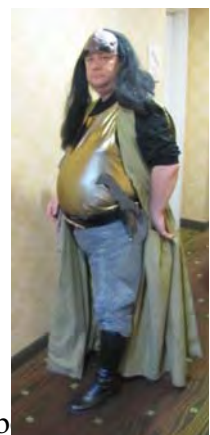
perfectly.

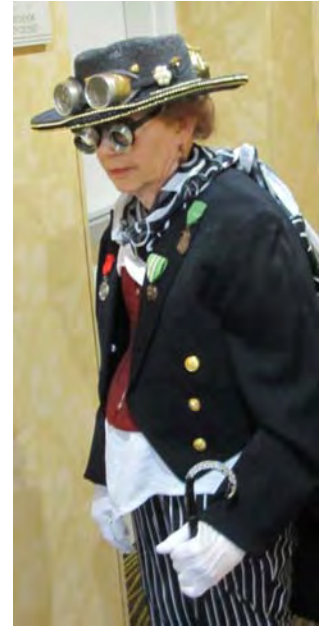

As always, things were learned. This time around we tried a new paperless signup procedure using an online Google Docs form. When everyone was signed up, I just downloaded the spreadsheet and a quick edit turned it into a running order and a set of cue cards for the MC. The new music cueing software worked well too. The curtain arrangement still needs some work, but Frances improvised.

Thanks again to Jean for donating prizes, to the crew – Sharan, Jean, Frances, Melissa, Chuck, Gerry, the Padegimases and the Duncans, and to judges Janeen, Robin and Laura.

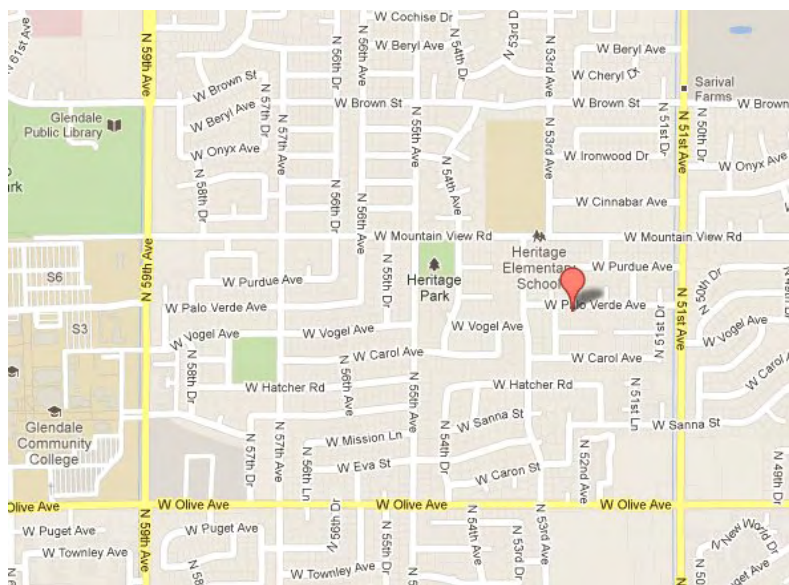
