It seems our favorite group project, the duct tape dress form, goes back much further than we realized. A Flickr collection of photographs from the Cornell University Library, seen at <http://www.flickr.com/photos/cornelluniversitylibrary/3855498503/in/photostream/> shows scenes from classes taught in rural New York circa 1914-1920 by Cornell’s extension service. Among the images are several of a class assembling tape dummies. Duct tape in its present form did not become available until



Monster Pincushion!

At the August meeting, Sharan demonstrated a simple pattern for a felt pincushion. The basic pattern is a lemon-shaped gore about seven inches long. Cut six of these and sew them together to form a sphere about four inches in diameter. Leave one end open and stuff with rice for weight and polyester fluff for volume, then sew the end shut. This sphere makes an excellent basis for creating amusing creatures.



Sharan added felt flippers and eyes made by draw stringing felt around shank buttons to create our prototype, "Froggy."

Margie added some felt tentacles for a Lovecraftian beast.



Work with the pattern a bit to create pumpkins, cactus, or anything your imagination leads to. Sharan has the handout from the class where she learned to make these beasties.


