Store Review: Ruffler's Roost

A friend and I checked out Ruffler's Roost last month. It is a lace, ribbon and trim store. There aren't a lot of fancy or unusual trims (SAS has more of the exotic) but what they do have is quite good. The inventory runs from basic ribbon of the standard types for craft (i.e. unwashable), paper and taffeta types to real ribbon (cloth, grosgrain, etc.). What they do have is lots of widths and colors of almost every type they stock. They also have a few buttons and little "chain" type items - the type you'd add to embellish a hat, bow, etc. My friend makes large flower hair ornaments and was impressed with what she found to add to her crafts.

I had been waiting to check this place out for a long time and finally Debbie and I made it. It was on University Drive near Gilbert. Unfortunately, we got there on their last day in that location. They've moved east to Higley Road, too far for me, but I was told that they have another location at Alma School and Elliot. I haven't checked out that location, but the manager told me that one stocks the same items.
