#### Mermaid Monday

In the two years since its completion, I have grown quite fond of the Odysea aquarium, located on Via de Ventura, just east of the Pima Freeway in the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Community. I decided to spend Memorial Day there this year. Costume-wise, this was a good call. There were mermaids!



These members of the Wands and Wishes Mermaids troupe are skilled freedivers in costumes which integrate a "monofin" to allow them to swim like dolphins. (Our Tasha has shared her experience learning to use such a swimming costume.) They appeared in the larger display tanks, swimming and interacting with children on the other side of the glass. The mermaids used a mouthpiece on a supplied-

air hose to extend their underwater time. During their performances, each mermaid was accompanied by a safety diver on scuba equipment, lurking just out of view.

While one mermaid performed in the tank, others held court from thrones in the lobby. Naturally the event included face painting, wand making and other children's activities.

I was there for something I had been looking forward to for many months -- the "SeaTrek" experience. They loan you a wetsuit, a pair of crocs and a digital camera, then the staff lowers a supplied-air helmet onto your shoulders and your party walks about on the bottom of one of the big tanks, surrounded by rays and sand sharks. For half an hour, you get to be that little plastic diver in the goldfish bowl.

Your photos are uploaded to Google Drive and you can download them later in the day. Yes, that's me next to the shark.



The rays are accustomed to people and get downright affectionate. It helps that our guide was carrying a squeeze bottle full of krill.

As part of the weekend event, we were joined by a mermaid. The experience was extra sweet because my dive partner was her dad. Check out the photo as she gives dad a hug and kiss.



Our guide taught us to throw bubble rings by scooping air from under our helmets and pushing it forward. The effect looks just like that thing Aquaman did in those cartoons from the 1960s. One of the mermaids was so skilled that she could make the bubble rings form heart shapes.

I don't think I could pull off the mermaid look myself, but the experience tempts me to build a swimmable Creature from the Black Lagoon costume. Ever since "The Shape of Water," he gets to play the romantic lead.


January 26, 2019 from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. The Tempe Public Library is hosting its annual Library FanCon (formerly known as Comicon)
