

#### **SWCG Activity September 29, 2025**

Put together fairly late, this was a casual meeting for ice cream at Cold Stone Creamery in Tempe Marketplace. Paula and Randall were there in the flesh while Mahala joined us by telephone.

We spoke of wide-ranging topics, with Randall showing pictures from his recent visit to the Phoenix Art Museum to view the Anna Sui fashion collection.

We brainstormed out some possible meetings for the rest of the year but did not set any of them in stone. Randall did some follow-up online research the next day, as summarized below.

Trevon Powell and Phoenix Historical Costuming Society are hosting the presentation, "Beneath the Bustle: The Transformative Fashions of the Victorian Period" at Sunnyslope Historical Society on October 5. This is a ticketed event with tix available via Eventbrite.

We received an invitation to Halloween Comic Fest at the Library at Velma Teague Library in Glendale on October 25. See the full write-up in the September Cactus Needles.

Friends of Fair Gathering will be held Saturday Nov 15 from 10-2 at Cuisine & Wine Bistro in Chandler. At first, I thought this was a follow-up to the renfaire swap meet I attended in January, but it seems this is a completely different event with a history going back 15 years. Yes, it is a garb event with food to order from the proprietors and dancing by Ghazall Beledi.

We discussed doing an antique shop crawl in downtown Glendale in connection with the annual Glendale Glitters holiday lights display. According to the City of Glendale website at <a href="Events">Events</a>, there will be a kick-off event on November 28 at the Glendale Civic Center and the lights will remain up until January 1.

Paula would like to host a Holiday potluck at her place in Tempe in December. Details and date not yet set. Whatcha think?

<u>Yes, there will be a LibCon West this year!</u> It has not been officially announced yet, but the event will be December 6 at the Foothills Branch near 57<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Union Hills.

Superhero Saturday will return on Jan 17, 2026 on the good side of Metro Parkway west. Randall had a fine time there last year watching the masquerade and schmoozing among the booths. It is superhero-themed and done as a charity fundraiser by the Phoenix Police Sergeants & Lieutenants Association. The feel is much like a library con with booths from many local interest groups.

We are set up with booth space at Tempe Library Con. Note that the date has moved back to its original timeslot on January 31, 2026.

#### Field trip idea - From Paula

Cogburn Ostrich Ranch. It's near Picacho Peak off I-10. When I first thought of it, I had no idea how the Ranch had expanded. I've pasted their description below. I originally thought this might be a good place to shop for feathers; while I couldn't find that they had them for sale, a lady in my Writers' Group is doing a book on animals of Arizona, including their history. She has an extensive chapter on ostriches in Arizona and has been to the Ranch. She said they do have very nice feathers for about \$4.00 apiece. She's seen ostrich feathers in craft shops like Michaels' and Hobby Lobby for over \$15.00 apiece and they weren't nearly as nice. The ranch doesn't have food for sale but does have some snacks and drinks available and has a very nice picnic area-you're allowed to bring in your own food. This might be a fun outing for us with the possibility of also buying feathers.

Ye editor visited years ago and bought ostrich eggs (they're a bit gamey). One scrambled served about 10 at campout. The Ranch is veery near Picacho Peak State Park – the site of the only civil war battle in Arizona.

"You might have seen us on any number of TV shows such as "Larry the Cable Guy – Only in America", "Extreme Roadside Attractions", "Chef vs City", "Amazing Animals", "Arizona Highways", and many more but there is no substitute for experiencing it up close and personal. Rooster Cogburn Ostrich Ranch is a three generation family owned and operated working ostrich ranch.

We have been open to the public since 1999 when it was just the ostrich to feed. Nowadays, however, there are lots of critters to feed! Joining the ostrich are Miniature Sicilian Donkeys, Nigerian Dwarf Goats, Fallow Deer, Peking Ducks, "The Goat Penthouse" and the "Hole in the Wall Gang" featuring Boer Goats, and the all-time favorite Rainbow Lorikeets. There is something for everyone here and more fun than you can imagine. Affordable family fun for all ages. Amusement parks and outdoor recreational activities."

Due to construction in the park surrounding the library, most of the lawn area in front of the library will not be accessible. There is only a small area of open park space directly in front of the library's entrance, but this might be enough space for mock combat practice from Syndicate Saber and the Kingdom of Umbria. If any of you would like to do something special during the event besides photo ops/hanging out (a performance, game, etc.), please let me know. Costumes should be age-appropriate for an audience including kids and teens. Prop weapons are permitted as part of your costume, but may be tagged by security. No real weapons are allowed.

The event will take place indoors and outdoors at the **Foothills Branch Library**, as well as around the neighboring ball parks on the Storywalk Path. However, there is ample space inside in case of rain.

**CHECKING IN** - Registration for cosplay guests will begin at **8 AM** and continue throughout the day. *Please check in at the guest registration table outside the library's west entrance.* We encourage you to attend for the entire day if possible. If you have been approved to have a table at LIBCON West (please see the **TABLES** section below), you will be sent additional check-in instructions by the Vendor Coordinator. (SWCG will have a table)

**COSTUMES** - LIBCON West is an all-ages, family-friendly convention. All costumes should be age-appropriate for an audience including kids and teens. Any prop weapons may be tagged by security. *No real weapons will be allowed*. The official weapons procedure can be viewed at libconwest.org/weapons-procedure.html.
